## Children's rights memory challenge

OBJECTIVE

To learn about children's rights and to exercise their memory.

MATERIAL

Memory cards, poster of Children rights, paper, pen



### Instructions

Depending on the size of the group, this activity can be done in small teams or all together.

From the grid included below, cut out the set of cards, one set of pictures and one set of words per group.

Place all cards with the blank side facing up and mix them up, participants will need to take it in turns to turn over a card each to try and find the pairs. If the pair is a match, they can keep it together, if it's not a match they place it back. When participants have found all the pairs, create a poster to display in the meeting room.

### Debrief:

- ▶ Do you think you have all these rights?
- ▶ What should you do if you think you don't have them?
- ▶ What 2 rights do you think are the most respected? What do you think are the least respected?

You have a right to play with other kids and have fun!



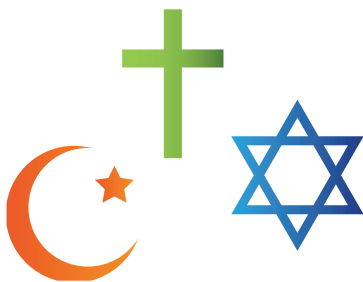
You have a right to be protected against engagement in war
